



## Los Angeles Papers Program

Organization of the program for the 95th Technical Conference, to be held April 12-17 at the Ambassador Hotel in Los Angeles, is proceeding at an encouraging pace. ## Action on Proposed Bylaw Amendments

The business meeting of the Society called for October 14, 1963, at the Hotel Somerset, was convened by President Reid H. Ray immediately following the Get-Together Luncheon of the 94th Technical Conference. This meeting has been called for the purpose of considering seven proposed Bylaw Amendments which had been published on page 713 of the September, 1963, *Journal* of the SMPTE. A count of voting members in attendance disclosed that the required quorum was not present to permit action by the meeting.

Accordingly, President Ray announced, that in view of the absence of a quorum, action would be taken in conformity with Section 2, Article XI of the Bylaws under which the proposed amendments would be referred to the Board of Governors.

Following adjournment of the Business Meeting, President Ray reconvened the Board of Governors which, with 20 members present and voting, acted to unanimously adopt each of the seven proposed amendments to the Bylaws as published in the September, 1963, *Journal*.
