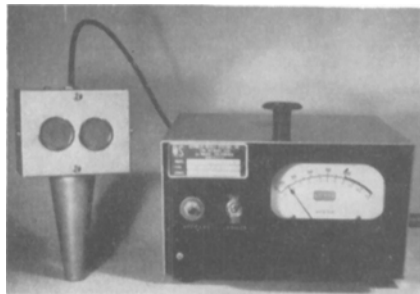

**An Acoustic Sound Monitor**, designed to measure accurately the sound intensity of any theater with respect to an increase or decrease of seated patrons has been introduced by Reynolds Rocket Systems, Inc., 2301 Alexdale Lane, La Puente, Calif. The sound monitor makes it possible for the projectionist to see at a glance whether the sound volume should be increased or decreased, and thus be enabled to maintain at all times a comfortable listening level.

**The Mitchell Triplex Tilthead** is designed to "do the job of three friction heads," according to an announcement from Mitchell Camera Corp., 666 W. Harvard St., Glendale, Calif. The design is based on the use of three compression springs, each accommodating a different weight, coupled with an "almost instantaneous" method of interchanging. The tilthead, fitting all standard Mitchell tripod bases, is designed to accept any Mitchell camera from the "16" professional to the heavy duty BNC. Other features include a variable top plate adjustment to permit instant correction to center of gravity; telescoping pan handle to adjust to a wide variety of positions, rotating 360° to provide right- or left-hand operation; built-in spirit level; and easily grasped large brake levels for locking the pan and the tilt. The tilthead is priced at \$700.00.

**The Cinephonic Mark IV system**, introduced by Fairchild Camera and Instrument Corp., 580 Midland Ave., Yonkers, N.Y., consists of an 8mm rear-screen, sound film portable projector and a plastic program cartridge about the size of a paperback book, which contains the 8mm magnetic sound film. Use of the cartridge simplifies operation by making unnecessary film handling, threading or rewinding. The projector weighs 20 lb and measures 13 by 14½ by 16 in. The program cartridge can hold up to 400 ft of 8mm color sound film for a maximum projection time of 22 min or up to 30 min in black-and-white.
