Test Site. The device is used to replace the magazine of a standard camera which photographs recording equipment that is monitoring the blast. When reaction data have been recorded, the magazine automatically processes the film and presents it for viewing. The rapid, controlled processing is said to protect the film from radiation damage.

Levitron, an air and liquid bearing processor for black-and-white 35/70mm film, introduced last year by Houston Fearless Corp., 11801 Olympic Blvd., Los Angeles, Calif. 90064 (*Journal*, p. 587, July 1963), is now available as a 16/35mm combination unit. The new model features bearings with 16mm and 35mm film paths side by side. Bearings are designed with retaining flanges to guide either of the two film widths through the processor. To use one only, the leader for the other is simply anchored at each end of the processing cycle to permit all the circulation of air and liquid to be used on the bearings in operation.
