The Montreal International Exhibition (EXPO 67) opens in April, 1967—18 months after the Montreal SMPTE Conference. Thus the Conference provides an excellent opportunity to

Nineteen-Sixty-Seven is also the Canadian Centennial Year. Because of the anticipated celebration throughout Canada, the Conference offers the unique opportunity for the Canadian Centennial Committee to hear papers and view equipment on various types of communications techniques and technologies.

Another aspect of the Conference that is generating interest is the planned emphasis on education. Educational procedures in the Quebec area have changed and created a need for innovations in educational equipment. **Anson Moorehouse**, topic chairman for *Motion Pictures and Television in Education*, is aware of the need for information in educational audio-visual techniques

and technology, and is planning his sessions accordingly. Many regular exhibitors in SMPTE Conferences plan to augment their exhibits with new audio-visual equipments, language labs and other educational equipments. Many companies which have never exhibited at SMPTE Conferences have shown a desire to do so.

Equipment Exhibit

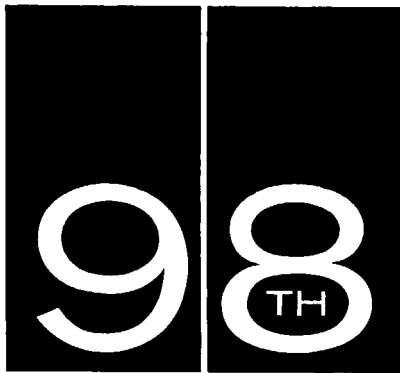
The 98th Conference Planning Committee originally obtained space for 69 booths, but because of the increasing interest of potential exhibitors, the exhibit area has been enlarged to accommodate 88 booths. Because this total cannot be exceeded, potential exhibitors should apply for booth space as early as possible if they wish to be accommodated.

A brochure containing a diagram of the exhibit area, rates, and all information needed to secure space at the Exhibit can be obtained from SMPTE headquarters, or from Exhibit Chairman **H. Patrick Dickey**, c/o Anglphoto Ltd., 160 Graveline St., Montreal 9, Que.

Once their space has been confirmed, exhibitors will be sent an Exhibitor's Manual containing detailed information on Customs procedures involved in moving goods in and out of Canada; booth furnishings; telephones; electrical and other special requirements.

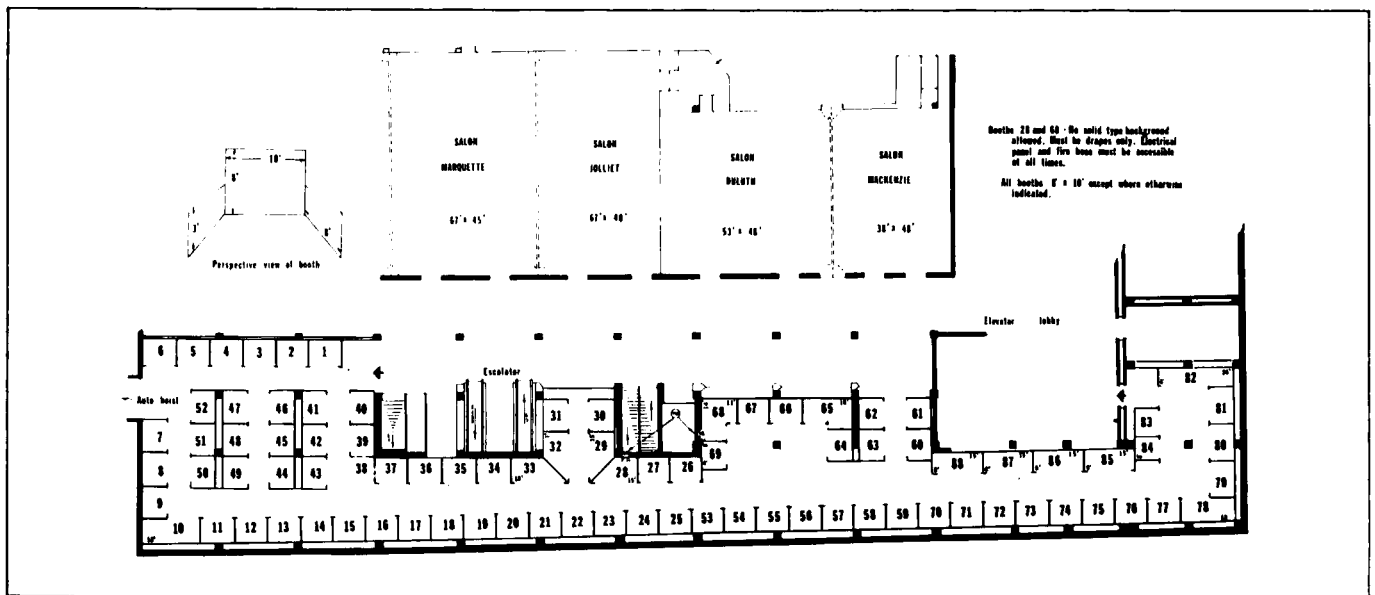
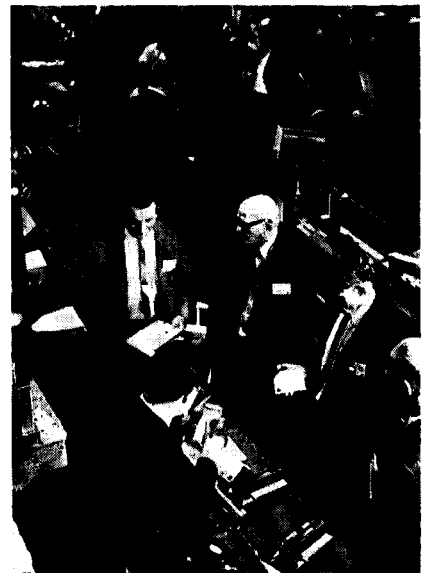
