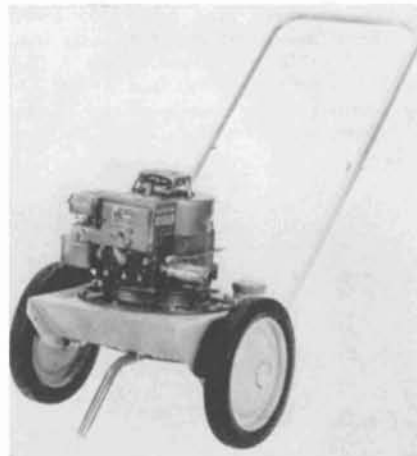

A telephone-type microphone handset for use in Vocoder systems has been announced by Altec Lansing, a Division of LTV Ling Altec, Inc., 1515 S. Manchester Ave., Anaheim, Calif. 92803. Designed for use in environments of high ambient noise and reverberant acoustics, the unit, designated Model 697A, is said to maintain excellent speech reproduction without masking or distortion. The microphone has a frequency response of 70 to 5,000 Hz and noise discrimination is said to average 15 dB. The output impedance is 150/250 Ω . It is priced at \$56.25.

The Kappa Super-n Video Cable Simulator, for simulation of from 25 to 250 ft of video cable in decade steps, has been announced by Kappa Networks, Inc., 165 Roosevelt Ave., Carteret, N.J. 07008. The simulator is available in two models, KR-250, an individual module, and KR-250-4, an assembly of four separate rack-mounted modules. Amplitude response the simulator is reported as flat within ± 0.05 dB to 12 MHz; ripple, less than ± 0.05 dB and group delay, $\pm 0.5\%$ to 12 MHz. The KR-250 is priced at \$350. The four-unit model, KR-250-4 is priced at \$1,100.



The Thermo-Fogger, a wheel-mounted device for the control of pests in motion-picture theaters (i.e., roaches, flies, mosquitoes, etc.) has been announced by Burgess Vibrocrafters, Inc., Grayslake, Ill. Designated Model F-2104, the device uses a friction-disc assembly which preheats the insecticide and force-pumps it into a chamber where it is mixed with the hot engine exhaust. The liquid is then converted to a vapor and propelled through the discharge nozzle as fog. The fog can move behind the walls to seek out the little pests and destroy them. Price is under \$235.

An electrical connector system featuring high contact density for undersea applications has been announced by Revere Corp. of America, a subsidiary of Neptune Meter Co., 845 N. Colony Rd., Wallingford, Conn. 06493. The bulkhead connector and cable assemblies have been hydrostatically tested for use at 15,000 lbf/in.² (approximately the pressure at 30,000 ft below sea level). The system is designed especially to supply power to and take signals from a wide range of undersea instruments including sound pickups and television cameras. The assembly consists of cable,

plug and bulkhead. The cable is molded to the plug to form a one-piece, leak-proof unit. Metals such as stainless steel, monel, and neoprene are used throughout the system to resist corrosion.

Acoustical doors up to 8 by 8 ft in pairs and 4 by 8 ft in single units have been announced by Overly Manufacturing Co., 574 W. Otterman St., Greensburg, Pa. 15602. The doors are available in a sound transmission class rating range of 35 to 62 dB and in thicknesses ranging from 1 $\frac{3}{4}$ to 4 in., or more, depending upon the required sound reduction and size. Sealing devices made of compressible neoprene are provided at jambs, head and sill of each door. The 1 $\frac{3}{4}$ -in. doors were tested with conventional hardware consisting of key-in-knob type locks and 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ -in. butt hinges.

A clear plastic reel with a built-in splicing block is supplied with all Soundcraft 7-in. audio tape, it was announced by Reeves Soundcraft Division of Reeves Industries Inc., Great Pasture Road, Danbury, Conn. The reel also has an etched indicator to show the percentage of tape remaining to be played or recorded and an easy-threading hub cutout. Flanges are numbered "1" and "2" for side identification and each reel has a frosted area for numbering, titling and dating.
