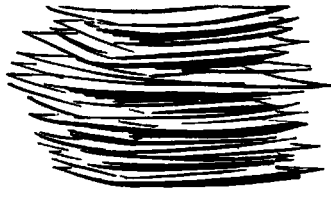

The program for the Winter Television Conference is now set with sixteen papers and four panel discussions which will make up the two-day program. The complete Program will appear in the January *Journal*. Program Chairman **Hugo A. Bondy** and his committee of Topic Chairmen have been working over the past several months to put the Conference in order, and the effort has paid off with an outstanding program that will go deeply into many of the practical problems facing TV broadcasters.

All panels and panel discussions will rely heavily on audience participation. With a view to encouraging and stimulating this, questionnaires have gone out to many television operating engineers to provide a basis for these discussions. It is expected that the return of these questionnaires, at an early date, will permit the distribution to the panel experts. They in turn will be able to prepare answers to the more involved problems prior to the conference. This is in keeping with the overall aim of the program to make this a practical and educational conference.
