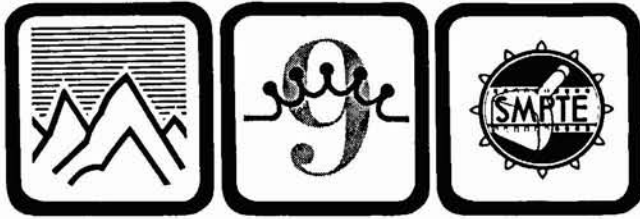


9TH INTERNATIONAL CONGRESS ON HIGH-SPEED PHOTOGRAPHY



DENVER, COLORADO • AUGUST 2 THROUGH AUGUST 7, 1970

Exhibit space for the 9th International Congress on High-Speed Photography is now available, according to SMPTE Conference Vice-President **E. B. (Mike) McGreal**, Producers Service Corp., Glendale, CA. The Exhibit will run concurrently with the 9th Congress Papers Program August 2-7, 1970, at the Denver Hilton Hotel in Denver.

Exhibit Chairman is **Willard H. Ebeling**, Perfect Film Laboratories, Inc., 3200 N. Nevada Ave., P.O. Box 1270, Colorado Springs, CO 80907. Ebeling said there are 67 booths available and several have already been sold. Exhibit space has been offered at this early date — more than a year before the Exhibit — to allow companies from outside the United States time to order space and arrange for transportation of equipment.

A large turnout of the leading professionals in instrumentation, high-speed photography and photoscience from all over the world is expected at the Congress. Experts in these fields will participate by attending the papers

sessions, exhibits and mingling and exchanging views with other experts from all over the world.

The Equipment Exhibit will open officially on Sunday, August 2, at noon, with a ribbon cutting ceremony. Immediately following the ceremony Congress registrants and exhibit pass holders will attend a complimentary cocktail party held in the Exhibit Area. Hours of the Exhibit are as follows:

An Equipment Papers and Demonstrations Session will be held Wednesday, Aug. 5, 9:00–12:00 noon. Many exhibitors will present brief descriptions or actual demonstrations of new equipments and products. Written papers with abstracts in English, French and German will be included in the preprinted papers given each delegate at registration, and for use by the interpreters. Each exhibitor's presentation will last about 15 minutes. Emphasis will be placed upon describing significant advances in the state of the art.

In recognition of exhibitors' efforts in preparing effective and rewarding displays, the Society will award a plaque to the company selected by the Exhibit Award Committee as having the most imaginative, effective and best-presented exhibit, regardless of size. The presentation will be reported in the *Journal* following the Congress.
