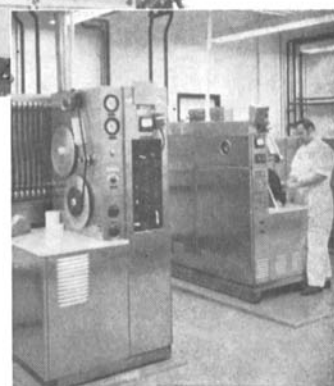
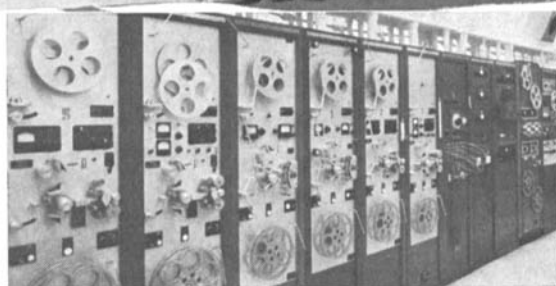
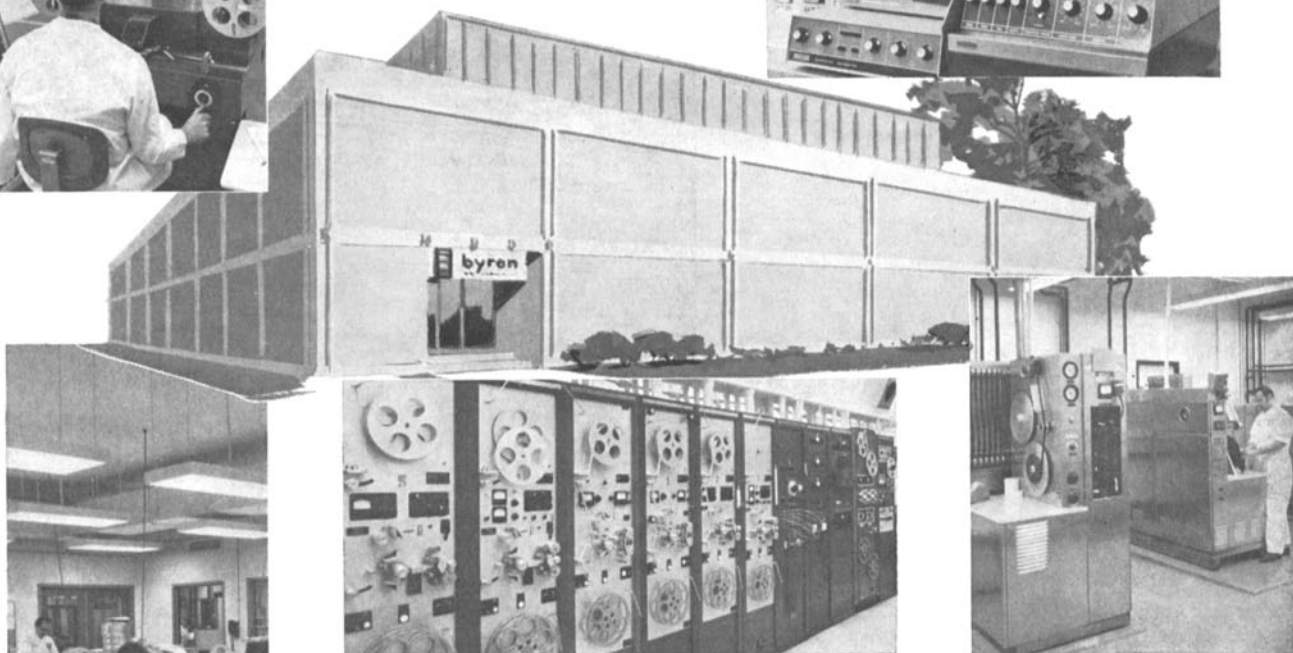
Call for Papers Requirements and Deadlines

Three copies of a 500- to 750-word synopsis of the paper (about two pages of double-spaced type-writing on format sheets supplied by the Society), giving the paper's objective and a summary of content should be sent to SMPTE Headquarters, Att: 108th Conference Program, 9 E. 41 St., New York, NY 10017. Synopses should be received at Headquarters by June 15, 1970, with three copies of the *Author Form* and the *Author Information Sheet*. The synopses will be published in a *Synopses Booklet* and will be used to prepare a 50- to 75-word abstract for the Program in the Conference issue of the *Journal* (September).

By August 28, 1970, the original and three copies of the manuscript should be sent to SMPTE Headquarters, Att: 108th Conference Program. Manuscripts will be reviewed as prospects for *Journal* publication.
