Two-Day Symposium

The special Symposium, assembled by Daniel R. Wells, Director of Engineering and Technical Operations, Public Broadcasting Service, Washington, D.C., and supervised by *K. Blair Benson*, SMPTE Vice-President for Television Affairs, will examine Public Broadcasting, a topic most timely in our communications-conscious community.

Overall responsibility for the Conference organization lies in the hands of *Harry Teitelbaum*, SMPTE Conference Vice-President, and for the papers program, in the hands of Editorial Vice-President, *Richard E. Putman*.

As is the custom authors will have an average of 20 minutes for the presentation of their papers, but a number of papers will be allotted 30 to 45 minutes, to allow for a more ample in-depth consideration and discussion.

Equipment Exhibit

Exhibit Chairman, *John J. Burlinson, Jr.*, has announced that a fine assortment of professional motion-picture and television equipment will be featured at the SMPTE Equipment Exhibit which begins May 1 at 5:00 p.m. Opening the Exhibit will be the Exhibitors' Open House to which all Conference registrants and holders of Exhibit passes are invited. Proposed Amendment to Bylaws

Annual Meeting, May 1, 1972, New York Hilton Hotel

To Voting Members of SMPTE

Notice is hereby given that the Annual Meeting of the Society of Motion Picture and Television Engineers, Inc., will be held at 1:30 p.m., local time, May 1, 1972, at the New York Hilton, New York.

The purpose of this meeting will be to vote on a proposed amendment to the Society's Bylaws. This amendment has been processed by the Revisions Committee, E. B. McGreal, Chairman, and approved by the Board of Governors.

The purpose of the proposed amendment is to enlarge the Fellow Membership Committee by the addition of the Section Chairmen, thus broadening the geographic and technical areas from which Fellow nominations can be received.

The proposed amendment is as follows:

Bylaws, Article V, Sec. 2, Subsec. C. Fellow Membership Committee

Amend to read: "The membership of this Committee shall consist of all members of the Board of Governors, the Chairmen of Engineering Committees and the Chairmen of Sections of the Society. The Past President shall serve as Chairman of the Committee; or, if unavailable, the President shall appoint a Chairman from among the members of the Committee. The Committee may recommend persons to the Board of Governors for election to membership in the Fellow grade."
