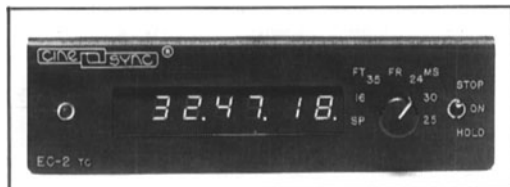

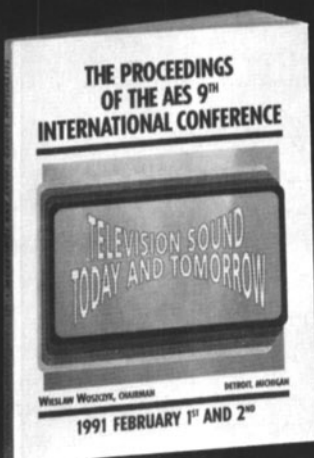

# Obituaries

**Willis R. Warren**, a Life Fellow of the Society, is dead. He joined the SMPTE in 1960 and was elected a Fellow in 1966, at which time he held the position of chief, supply and equipment branch, U.S. Information Agency (U.S.I.A.). A veteran of WWII, Warren had worked in the motion-picture division of the Office of the Coordinator of Inter-American Affairs. It was there that he established a reputation for being able to obtain maximum results with a minimum expenditure of government funds. After the war he helped to develop the motion-picture section to provide a real peacetime service in many foreign countries. He was responsible for the development of Seven-O-Rama and its operation at the Moscow Fair in 1959. He had been twice honored by the U.S.I.A., receiving the Meritorious Service Award in 1959 and the Superior Service Award in 1962.

**Stuart N. Wilson**, an Active Member of the Society, died on January 6, 1991. He joined the Society as an Associate Member in 1957, while he was employed by Harry S. Goodman Productions. He later worked as production supervisor for WNDT-Channel 13 in New York, senior instructor at the RCA Institute, and dean of the Sylvania TV School. He upgraded his status to Active Member in 1987, at which time he was director emeritus of the Center for Media Arts.

**Robert L. Shoemaker**, an Active Member, died on January 27 at the age of 83. A longtime audio equipment sales representative in Winnetka, Ill., he is believed to be the first A/V manufacturer's representative to initiate a completely mobile operation. In 1969, while working as president of Avaco-LaBelle Courier, he incorporated his office, showroom, and living quarters in a mobile van, complete with radio/telephone communications. He used the vehicle to cover his four-state territory.

**Frank L. Kormash**, an Associate Member, died on July 25. He joined the Society in 1957 and, until his retirement, was employed by Wilding Picture Productions, Inc.

**Marjorie A. Sirkin**, a Student Member, died of leukemia on January 18, at the age of 38. A freelance assistant film editor, she had attended UCLA, Temple University, University of Delaware, University of Miami, and Sherwood Oaks Experimental College.
