

# 33rd SMPTE Advanced Motion Imaging Conference Omni Rosen Hotel, Orlando, FL February 25-27, 1999



SMPTE's 33rd Advanced Motion Imaging Conference will travel to the southern end of the U.S. next year taking place in Orlando, FL. The conference, to be held on February 25 to 27, 1999 at the Omni Rosen Hotel, will follow the theme "Innovation, Implementation, and Operation—The Challenges of Change." Conference activities consist of four technical sessions chaired by Program Chairman Clyde D. Smith, Speer Worldwide Digital, and an all-day seminar conducted by Universal Studio's Oliver Peters. Albert LeBoeuf, Lockheed Martin, and David Walters, Snell & Wilcox, Inc., will serve as General Arrangements co-chairs.

Co-chairs Stephen Flanagan, Post Newsweek, and Duane Carter, USA, Inc., commence program activities with their "Acquisition" session on Thursday morning, February 25. The baton will be passed to Marcos Obadia, Discovery International, and Mark Rogers, Tektronix, who will present a session on "Post-Production."

"Integration," co-chaired by Jack Winter, TV-28, and Jim Biggers, Post Newsweek, will take place on Friday morning, February 26. Doug Lung, Telemundo, and Rick Ackerman, Turner Entertainment, conclude the technical presentations with a "Distribution and Transmission" session.
