

Forthcoming Professional Meetings

IBC 78, International Broadcasting Convention, London, 25-29 September 1978. A small supply of programs for this meeting are available to members upon request to SMPTE Headquarters. The meeting will comprise 82 papers on the following subjects: microprocessors and mini-computers in broadcasting, point-to-point transmission, video signal origination and processing, transmitters and transposers, video and audio recording and storage, transmitting antennae, satellites in broadcasting, teletext broadcasting systems, stereo and quadraphonic sound systems, teletext subtitling systems, new broadcasting systems, and future possibilities in radio receiver design.

Sci/Com 78, the biennial symposium of the American Science Film Association (ASFA), will be held 7-10 November at the Museum of Science & Industry in Chicago. Two major program blocks will be devoted to energy and preventative medicine. Science media will receive attention in three other program blocks — on computer animation, films in the university and the technological developments currently emerging. One of the special attractions will be the film/video showcase running throughout the three days. At least 30 subjects will be chosen for the program blocks and evening screenings. All others, probably around 100 films and tapes, will be available in a library/screening room for individual review by any delegate. The Fourth Annual Video Programming Workshop will be held 14-16 November at the Temple University Center City Campus, 1619 Walnut St., Philadelphia. Subject areas to be discussed include software development for instructional design in business and industry, government and public services, education and health sciences; new technology; budget and fiscal responsibilities; program sources; program utilization; and the staffing and management of a television facility. 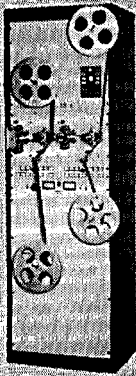

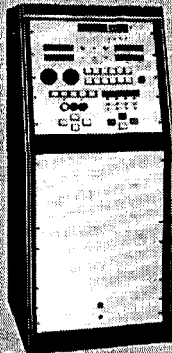

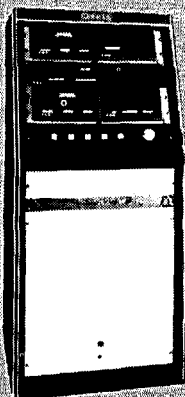
