

Editorial Vice-President Appoints New Board of Editors

Maurice L. French, Editorial Vice-President, has announced the appointment of a new 24-member Board of Editors, effective January 1, 1981. The new Board has been structured on a one year basis, and will be under the chairmanship of Calvin M. Hotchkiss, a 30-year member of the Society.

Chairman Hotchkiss is a Fellow of the Society and is a Governor for the New York Region (1981-82). He has also served as Chairman of the Nomenclature Committee and was Program Chairman of the 111th Technical Conference.

It is now recommended that the term of office of the chairman and members of the Board of Editors be concurrent with that of the Editorial Vice-President.

The Board of Editors reviews the suitability of manuscripts for publication in the *SMPTE Journal*. It is the responsibility of the Board to accept or reject, or make recommendations that will qualify material for the *Journal* on the basis of technical merit. The members of the Board are chosen so as to be representative of the various disciplines of the motion picture and television industry.

According to Vice-President French, "We must continue to retain recognized experts on the Board of Editors, qualified to review papers submitted for publication in this rapidly advancing and changing age of technology."

The duties of the Board of Editors have been expanded to include the task of searching and obtaining papers for possible publication. Maintaining a high quality, scientific engineering journal is formidable, but it is a challenge to which the new Board is firmly committed.

Standards & Recommended Practices

Approved American National Standards

Revisions of four American National Standards were approved by the American National Standards Institute on 15 August 1980: ANSI PH22.159.1-1980, Specifications for 8-mm Type S Model 1 Motion-Picture Film Camera Cartridge, Cartridge-Camera Interface and Take-up Core Drive; ANSIPH22.161-1980, Dimensions of Magnetic Striping of 8-mm Type S Motion-Picture Film; ANSI PH22.162-1980, Dimensions of Magnetic Striping of 16-mm Motion-Picture Film Perforated 8-mm Type S, (1-4); and ANSI PH22.163-1980, Dimensions of Magnetic Striping of 35-mm Motion-Picture Film Perforated 8-mm Type S, 5R.

Approved International Standard

The International Organization for Standardization (ISO) recently approved an International Standard, the technical content of which is published here for your information. ISO 29-1980, Cinematography—Projector Usage of 8-mm Type R Silent Motion-Picture Film for Direct Front Projection—Specifications, is in agreement with American National Standard ANSI PH22.22-1975 except that ANSI PH22.22 does not have a secondary 16 frame-per-second specification.
