Call for Papers

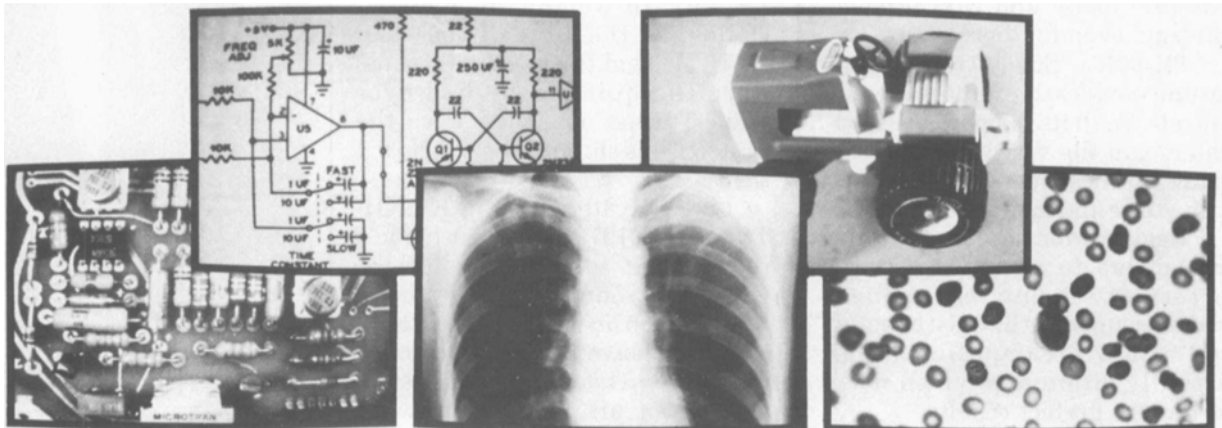
