Approved American National Standards

The American National Standards Institute approved two American National Standards on April 26, 1984: ANSI PH22.194-1984, Motion-Picture Film (35-mm) — Projector Usage — Release Prints Having Four Perforations Per Frame; and ANSI PH22.195-1984, Motion-Picture Film (35-mm) — Projectable Image Area — Motion-Picture Prints. Approved SMPTE Engineering Guidelines

Two SMPTE Engineering Guidelines were approved by the Society's Board of Governors: EG 7-1984, Audio Sync Pulse for 8-mm Type S Cameras, Magnetic Audio Recorders and Rerecording Projectors; and EG 3-1984, Projection for Technical Conferences. Approved International Standard

The International Organization for Standardization (ISO) recently approved an International Standard, the technical content of which is published here for your information. ISO 3642-1983, Cinematography — Cemented or Welded Splices on 8-mm Type

S Motion-Picture Film for Projector Use — Dimensions, is in agreement with SMPTE Recommended Practice RP 122-1983, Dimensions of Cemented Splices on 8-mm Type S Motion-Picture Film, Projection Type. Two Proposed American National Standards are subject to a trial period and public review. The technical content is unaffected, as the modifications are editorial in nature. The changes are being published for your information and comment.

PH22.94, Television — Image Areas and Mounts — Slides and Opaques (Revision of ANSI PH22.94-1973 (R1979) published in the November 1973 *Journal*): Update reference documents to read: SMPTE RP 9-1983 instead of 1966 and ANSI PH3.43-1977 instead of 1969. Delete reference to ANSI PH22.144-1969, which has been withdrawn.

PH22.192, Motion-Picture Equipment — Shipping Reels for 35-mm Prints (Revision of ANSI PH22.192-1976 published in the April 1977 *Journal*): Specifications for plastic and metal 2000-ft shipping reels have been added as Appendix A2.
