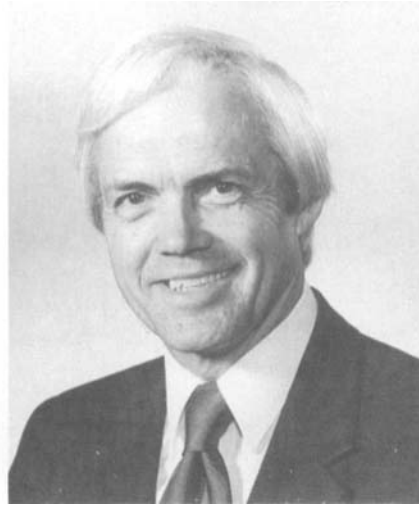
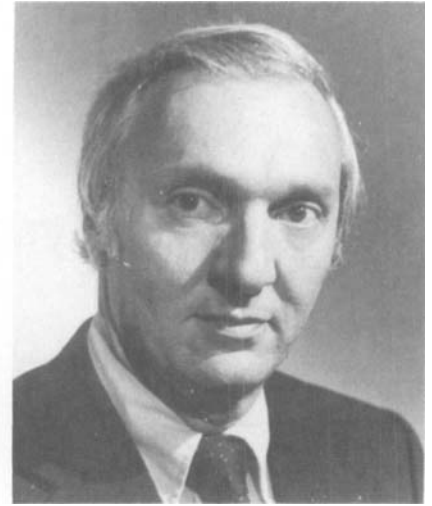




Richard G. Streeter, Engineering V.P.

## SMPTE Holds Annual Elections for Officers and Governors

The Society has announced the results of its annual elections of officers and governors for the 1986-1987 term. Three national officers, Engineering Vice-President, Financial Vice-President, and Sections Vice-President, were elected, as were seven new governors.

Richard G. Streeter, director of advanced development, CBS Broadcast, was elected Engineering Vice-President. Blaine Baker, president, Motion Picture Laboratories, Inc., was elected Financial Vice-President. Sherwin H. Becker, vice-president and director of engineering, Allied Film Laboratory, was elected Sections Vice-President. All three were the incumbents.

The results of the election were announced at the annual Honors and Awards Luncheon held Monday, October 28, 1985, at the Los Angeles Convention Center. The luncheon was held in conjunction with the 127th SMPTE Technical Conference and Equipment Exhibit that took place at the Convention Center October 17-November 1.

NBC, Burbank, Calif., and Donald C. McCroskey, ABC Inc. (retired), Burbank, Calif.; *Southern Region:* John F. Swanson, Cox Communications, Inc., Atlanta, Ga.; *Western Region:* John Streets, Merlin Engineering Works, Palo Alto, Calif.

The following is a brief background of the newly elected SMPTE officers:

*Engineering Vice-President:* Richard G. Streeter. At CBS Broadcast, Streeter is director of advanced development, responsible for the development and specifications of equipment utilizing new technology, and is involved in the development and review of specifications and standards for TV equipment. During his 22 years in the industry, he has played a major role in the advancement of studio and portable camera designs and videotape used for ENG, as well as having project responsibility for the first electronic cinematography camera, which have been recognized by Emmy Awards. He works closely with international manufacturers, broadcast organizations, and research labs. Streeter is a Fellow of SMPTE, has been active on local and national levels, and is a member of NAB Conference Committee and EBU G-4-Subgroup. He served as Engineering Vice-President for the 1984-1985 term.

*Financial Vice-President:* Blaine Baker, president, Motion Picture Laboratories, Inc. Memphis, Tenn.

For many years he was with Versatile TV Productions, before joining Motion Picture Laboratories in 1966. He was appointed by the Governor of Tennessee to the State Film Board, and for years has been instrumental in setting up programs and seminars for MPL, introducing new systems and techniques, i.e., tape-to-film transfers, comparison studies of Ektachrome versus color negative film. He is an SMPTE Fellow. Active in Society affairs, Baker has been Section Chairman, as well as Governor of the Society, for a number of years. He served as Financial Vice-President for the 1984-1985 term.

*Sections Vice-President:* Sherwin H. Becker, vice-president, director of engineering, Allied Film Laboratory, Inc., Detroit, Mich. Becker joined the Society in 1955, and was elected a Fellow in 1978. He served as Sections Vice-President for the 1984-1985 term, and as Secretary/Treasurer and Chairman, Detroit Section. He has served two terms as Governor; as speaker at numerous section meetings; as Chairman, Laboratory Services Technology Committee; Specialist to ISO; and Chairman of the Warner, Kalmus, and Kodak Award Committees. He has also been a member of the Long-Range Planning, Revisions and Financial Advisory Committees.
