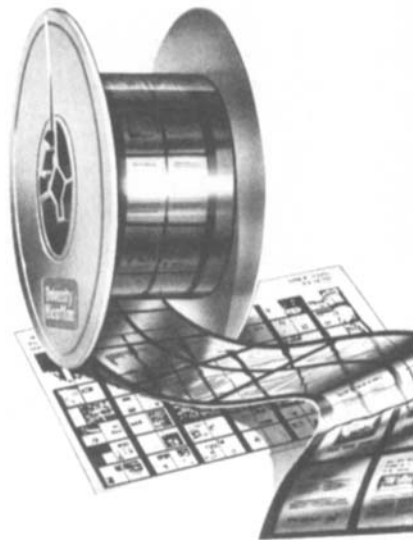

Frederick M. Remley Named Chairman of Board of Editors

Frederick M. Remley, director of Michigan Media, Television and Film Center, University of Michigan, has been named Chairman of the SMPTE Board of Editors, it was announced by SMPTE Editorial Vice-President Howard T. La Zare, Deluxe Laboratories, Inc. He succeeded the previous chairman, Calvin M. Hotchkiss, on July 1, 1985.

Remley has played an active part in Society affairs for many years. He joined the Society in 1954, and was made a Fellow in 1967. From 1979 to 1981, he served as SMPTE Vice-President for Television Affairs, and as Vice-President for Educational Affairs for the 1982-1983 term, in addition to serving on the Board of Editors. He has been a participant in several committees, including Fellow Membership; New Technology, which he chaired from 1975 through 1979; and Video Recording and Reproduction Technology, which he chaired from 1966 through 1970. He is also currently serving as Governor, Central Region, for the 1985-86 term.

Remley has also represented the Society on various international committees, has held several offices in the Detroit Section, and served as topic chairman and program chairman of SMPTE Conferences. In 1978, he was awarded the Citation for Outstanding Service to the Society. In his capacity as Chairman of the Board of Editors, he will be in charge of the reviewers who consider articles and recommend them for publication in the *SMPTE Journal*.



Joseph A. Flaherty Nominated to French Legion of Honor

Joseph A. Flaherty, vice-president and general manager, CBS operations and engineering, CBS/Broadcast Group, has been nominated to the rank of Chevalier de l'Ordre National de la Legion d'Honneur by President Mitterand of the Republic of France. The French government bestowed the Order of Chevalier on Flaherty in recognition of his efforts aimed at promoting friendship and understanding between France and the U.S.

Flaherty has been a member of the CBS professional engineering staff since 1957. A Fellow of the SMPTE, he is a member

of a number of international broadcasting and engineering organizations, including the Societe des Electriciens, des Electroniciens, et des Radioelectriciens (SEE) of France. He has been the recipient of a number of prestigious awards, including the David Sarnoff Gold Medal, presented by the SMPTE in 1974 for major contributions to the television industry, including the planning of complex network television production centers, and the Progress Medal, presented in 1984. He also received an Emmy citation in 1969 for the development of the CBS minicam color camera, and the National Association of Broadcasters Engineering Award in 1983.
