The New York Institute of Technology (NYIT), Old Westbury, N.Y., announced that its Science and Technology Research Center in Port Everglades, Fla., has developed patented technology for the high-definition television (HDTV) system. NYIT's patent, which processes HDTV signals to allow for their transmission over standard broadcast channels, was demonstrated at the 1986 convention of the National Association of Broadcasters (NAB), held in April in Dallas, Texas. The NYIT Science and Technology Re-

search Center, established in 1975 in an effort to develop technology in the fields of advanced television and diagnostics, has been promoting its system as a new U.S. broadcast standard for HDTV.

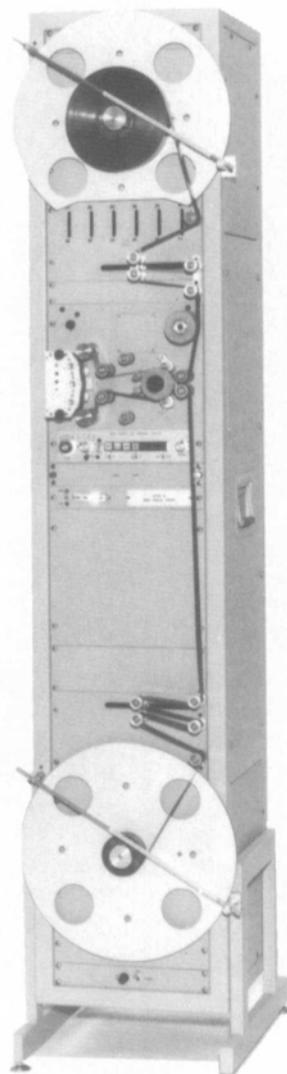
