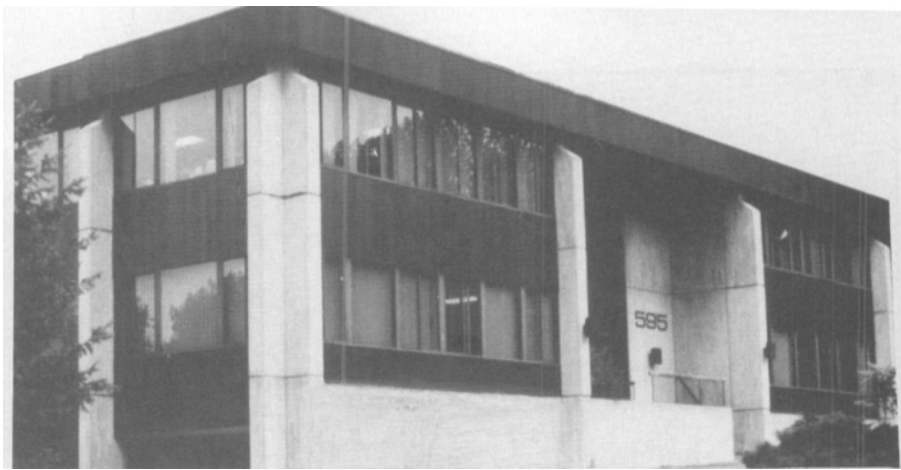




New SMPTE Headquarters Officially Opens

On Thursday evening, June 12, a dinner reception was held at the Society's new headquarters in White Plains, N.Y., to mark its official opening. Organized under the auspices of SMPTE President Harold J. Eady, Novo Communications, Inc., and arranged by the Society's Executive Director, Lynette Robinson, the lively event drew about 140 people. It was a time not only to celebrate the SMPTE's move to more spacious quarters, but a time for the Society's officers, governors, sections chairmen, and headquarters staff to mingle, come to know one another, and engage in good conversation.

West Hartsdale Avenue is the seventh location of the SMPTE headquarters since the inception of the Society in 1916.

The new headquarters is located in a 14,000 ft² building of modern construction, with an exterior featuring exposed concrete and bronze-colored aluminum panels. It is situated on the fringe of a rapidly developing corporate district in central Westchester County, approximately 20 miles north of midtown New York City.

Out of this facility, the administrative, engineering, editorial, membership, exhibits, advertising, and other departments will be able to provide expanded services to the Society's members.

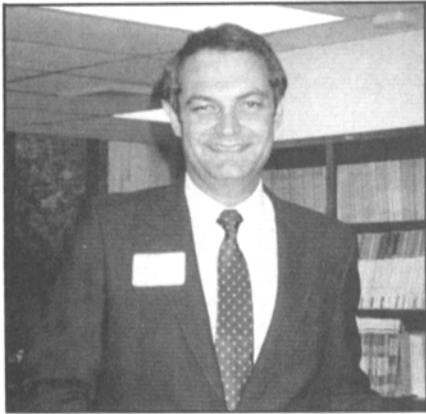

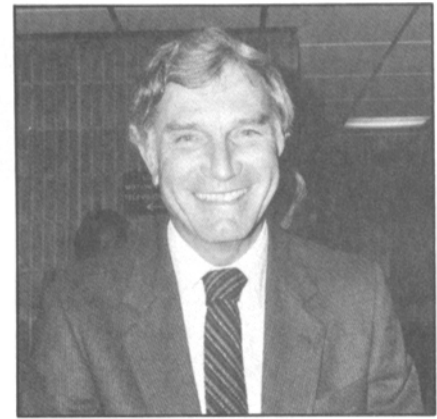

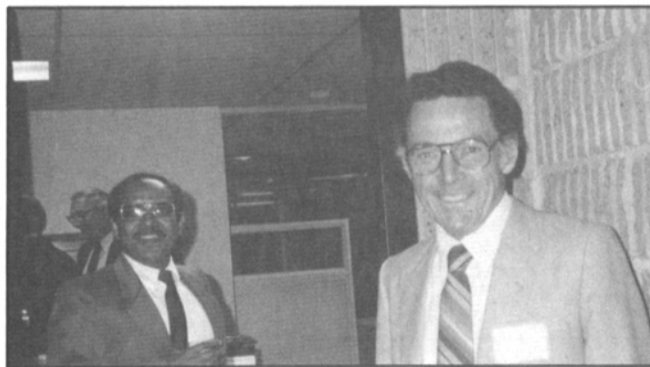

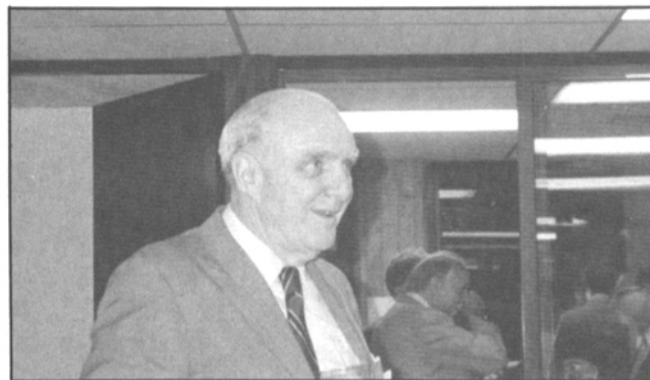

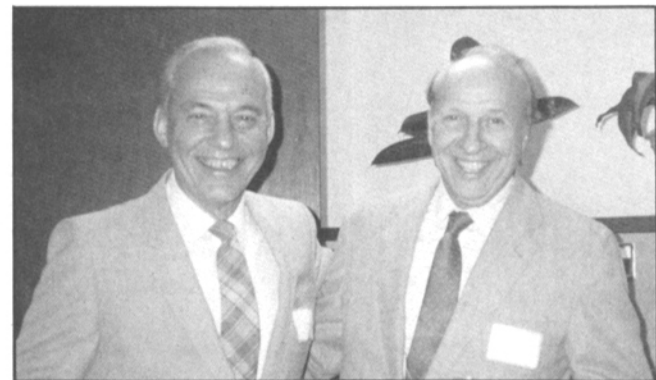

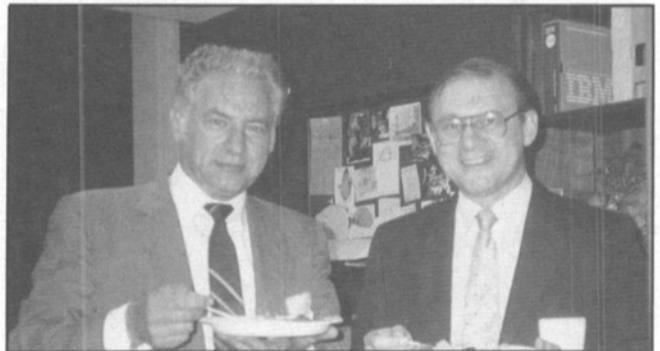
