

130th SMPTE Technical Conference and Exhibit

October 15-19, 1988, New York City

The SMPTE will be in New York for the 130th Technical Conference and Equipment Exhibit.

The 130th Technical Conference and Equipment Exhibit of the Society of Motion Picture and Television Engineers will be held October 15-19, 1988, at the Jacob K. Javits Convention Center in New York City.

Professional engineers and engineering executives from all parts of the world are expected at the conference, which annually provides an important forum for discussions and demonstrations on advanced motion-picture and television technology. The Society is looking for the 130th to break the attendance record of 17,056, which was set last year in Los Angeles.

Call for Papers

SMPTE Editorial Vice-President Howard T. La Zare, Deluxe Laboratories, Inc., has issued a call for papers for the conference technical program. La Zare, Program Chairman Ed Burns, Eastman Kodak Co., and Program Vice-Chairman Frank J. Haney, Capital Cities/ABC, Inc., encourage engineers, scientists, researchers, and executives to participate in the program.

The technical program will reflect "Innovations in Imaging and Sound," the theme of the conference. Television papers will cover video recording,

electronic production and post-production, digital systems, image processing, video graphics and special effects, audio technology, test and measurement, signal routing and distribution, extended and high-definition television, and other topics.

Appropriate motion-picture papers would be those describing new films, innovative uses of lighting, applications of computers in the laboratory, techniques for film-to-tape transfers, production and post-production, and related subjects.

For a technical paper to be considered for the program, the author should send his name, company affiliation (if applicable), address, telephone number, and a 100-word abstract of the proposed paper to SMPTE, Att.: Editorial/Program Coordinator, 595 W. Hartsdale Ave., White Plains, NY 10607, by June 15, 1988. Author forms, which are available from SMPTE, should also be filed by that date. No consideration can be given to an author if his written materials are received after the June 15 deadline.

If the program committee finds the subject material suitable for presentation at the conference, the author will be notified by SMPTE to submit, by August 19, 1988, a 500-750 word

synopsis and completed manuscript.

Manuscripts submitted for the program will be preprinted and made available for sale at the conference. They will also be considered for publication in the *SMPTE Journal*.

SMPTE members and nonmembers alike may present papers at the conference. Presentations are normally 25-35 minutes long and can be supplemented by audiovisuals.

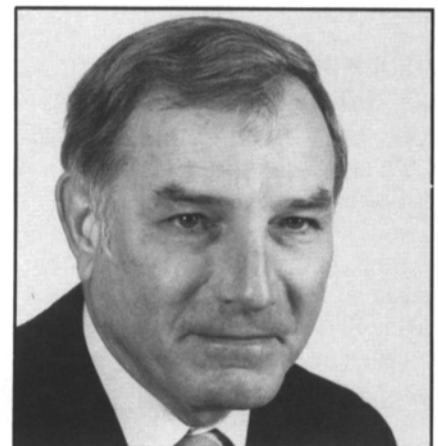

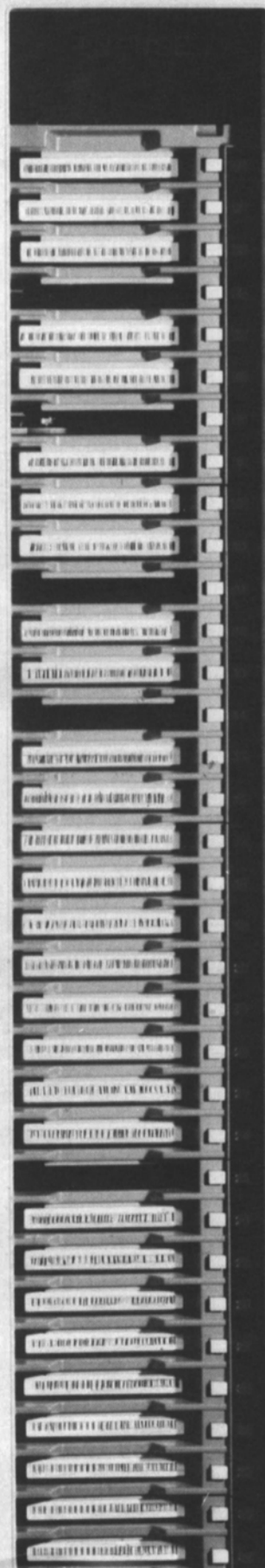
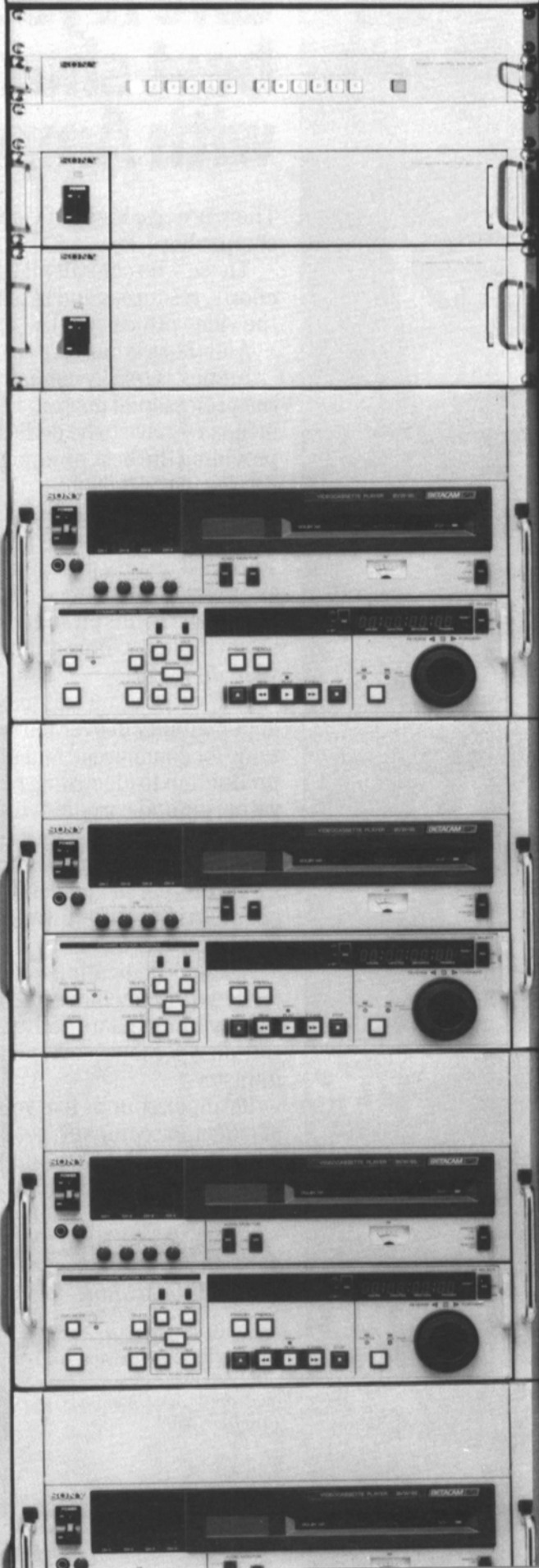
