

# SMPTE Holds Annual Elections

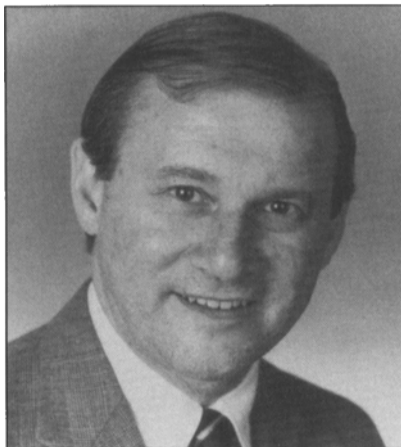
The Society has announced the results of the 1989 national election, in which four officers were chosen to serve the 1990-91 term. Stanley N. Baron, NBC, Inc., was reelected as Engineering Vice-President; Richard K. Schafer, Eastman Kodak Co., was elected Financial Vice-President; L. John Spring, Jr., Eastman Kodak Co., was elected Conference Vice-President; and Irwin W. Young, Du Art Film Laboratories, Inc., was reelected Sections Vice-President.

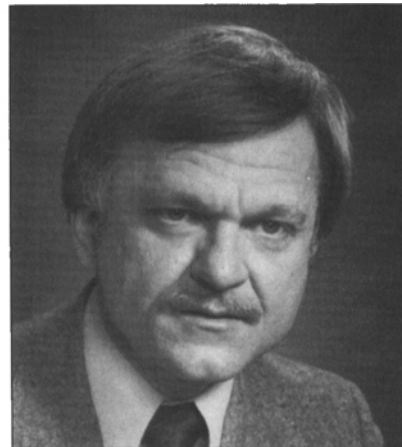

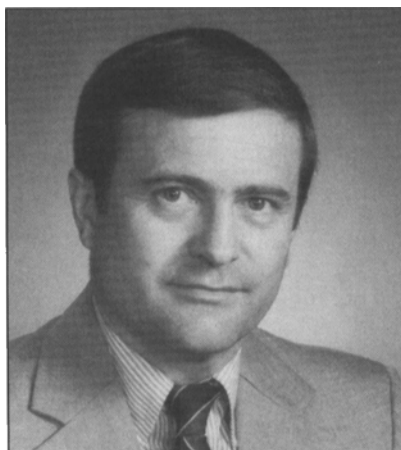
