

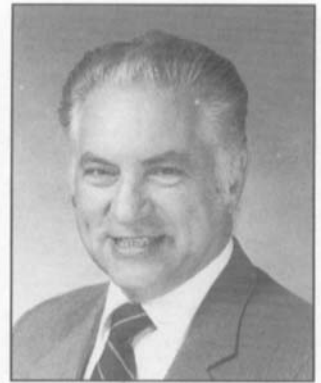

SMPTE Holds Annual Elections Blaine Baker Chosen as President

The Society has announced the results of its 1990 national elections, in which four officers were chosen to serve the 1991-92 term. Blaine Baker, MPL/PostMasters, Inc., was elected as SMPTE President, and Irwin W. Young, Du Art Film Laboratories, was elected Executive Vice-President. Frank J. Haney, Capital Cities/ABC, Inc., was reelected to a second term as Editorial Vice-President, and Bernard L. Dickens, CBS Broadcast Group, will serve a second term as Secretary/Treasurer. All of these terms will begin in January 1991.

Current President Maurice L. French, Canadian Broadcasting Corp., moves on to become Past President of the Society. The position of Sections Vice-President, left vacant by Irwin Young's election as Executive Vice-President, has not been filled as of this writing.

President-elect Blaine Baker, president of MPL/PostMasters, Inc., has just completed a two-year term as Executive Vice-President. A member since 1957, Baker has served the SMPTE in many other capacities, holding the positions of Financial Vice-President, Conference Vice-President, Nashville Section Chairman, Governor of the Southern Region, as well as being a member of the Standards Committee and numerous awards committees. Baker is a Fellow of the Society.

Newly elected Executive Vice-President Irwin W. Young, chairman of the board, Du Art Film Laboratories, Inc., has served as Sections Vice-

President since 1987. He has held many other Society positions, including Chairman, Secretary/Treasurer, and Manager of the New York Section, Governor of the New York Region, and as Chairman and member of the award committees for such honors as the Herbert T. Kalmus Memorial Medal Award, the Agfa-Gevaert Gold Medal Award, the John Grierson International Gold Medal Award, and the Citation for Outstanding Service to the Society. He also served twice as General Arrangements Chairman, twice as Film Program Chairman, and once as Entertainment Chairman for technical conferences held in New York City. Young, a Fellow of the SMPTE, was honored with the Society's Progress Medal in 1987.

Frank J. Haney, director of television facilities, Capital Cities/ABC, Inc., will begin his second term as Editorial Vice-President. Haney's previous activities in the Society include service as Editorial Director from 1986 to 1988, Program Chairman for the 129th Technical Conference, and Program Vice-Chairman for the 128th Technical Conference. He has also been a member of various SMPTE committees for more than 25 years. Haney was made a Fellow of the Society in 1988.

Bernard L. Dickens, senior staff scientist, engineering and development, CBS Broadcast Group, has held the position of Secretary/Treasurer since 1989. Previous service to the Society has included a term as

Governor of the New York Region from 1988 to 1989, as well as membership in the Standards Committee and numerous engineering committees, and as Chairman of the Television Recording and Reproduction Technology Committee from 1983 to 1987. Dickens is also a Fellow of the Society.

The results of the SMPTE elections were announced at the annual Honors and Awards Luncheon on Saturday, October 13, 1990, in New York City. The luncheon was part of the 132nd SMPTE Technical Conference and Equipment, which ran from October 13 to 17 at the Jacob K. Javits Convention Center.
