

2009 Lou Wolf Memorial Scholarship

THE LOU WOLF MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP IS DESIGNED TO HELP STUDENTS FURTHER THEIR UNDERGRADUATE OR GRADUATE STUDIES IN MOTION PICTURES AND TELEVISION, WITH AN EMPHASIS ON TECHNOLOGY.

Eligibility

Applicants must be:

1. Full-time students enrolled in an accredited high school, 2- or 4-year college or university
2. Current members of SMPTE. SMPTE Student membership is available for \$35 per year; for more information and a listing of student chapters visit www.smpte.org.

Amount of Scholarship The amount of the scholarship will be up to \$2,000. Each award will be paid to the accredited educational institution the scholarship winner is attending. In addition, the award includes full conference registration to the 2009 SMPTE Technical Conference and Exhibition in Hollywood, CA. Scholarship winners will be recognized at the Honors and Awards Ceremony during the Conference.

Application Requirements Applicants must submit this page, along with the following:

1. Current official transcript (grade report).
2. Personal statement of work experience and/or interests that are relevant to the application.
3. Personal statement of goals and objectives of study. This statement should explain the reasons why the applicant wishes to pursue studies in motion pictures and television with an emphasis on technology, and must be signed by the Applicant.

4. Personal statement of proposed use of funds. Funds may be applied toward tuition, books, supplies, and/or equipment that will further the Applicant's studies.
5. Two (2) letters of recommendation from responsible persons, citing the specific reasons why the Recommender believes the Applicant is deserving of the Scholarship. The letter of recommendation must be signed and dated and must include the Recommender's name, title, address, telephone number, and email address. One letter of recommendation must come from a SMPTE student chapter advisor or a Governor of SMPTE.

Applicants who are not attending institutions where a student chapter is located may contact Sally-Ann D'Amato for a listing of Governors and their contact information.

The SMPTE 2009 Student Paper Award

IT IS THE PURPOSE OF THIS AWARD TO RECOGNIZE THE OUTSTANDING PAPER PREPARED AND SUBMITTED BY A STUDENT MEMBER.

The paper receiving the Student Paper Award will be published in the *SMPTE Motion Imaging Journal*, giving recognition to the author and the institution at which the work was done. The Award winner will also receive a full conference registration to the 2009 SMPTE Technical Conference and Exhibition in Hollywood, CA, where they will be recognized at the Honors and Awards Ceremony.

Application Requirements

1. Applicants must be current SMPTE Student Members. Student Membership is available for \$35 per year. Join at www.smpte.org.
2. The paper must deal with some technical phase of motion pictures, television, photographic instrumentation, or their closely allied arts and sciences. To aid the Student Member as to whether the subject matter and significance of the paper might be acceptable for review by the SMPTE Journal Award Committee, the nearest Local Section Chair of the Society and/or the Faculty Advisor (if the Student is a member of the Student Chapter) should be consulted. A listing of Local Section Chairs can be found in the *SMPTE Motion Imaging Journal* or on the SMPTE website, www.smpte.org.
3. The style and format shall be similar to that for papers published in the *SMPTE Motion Imaging Journal*. It should not exceed 3,000 words in length. Papers will be evaluated on:
 - a. Technical merit
 - b. Originality
 - c. Presentation

These criteria will be used to evaluate the author's understanding of the subject, contribution to the information or literature, and ability to organize and present material clearly.

Application Procedure

1. All submitted papers must have the following information on the title page:
 - a. Title of paper
 - b. Applicant's name
 - c. Applicant's address, phone number, and email Address
 - d. Name of school
 - e. Faculty member's or academic advisor's name and signature
2. All submissions must be accompanied by a copy of a current Student ID card, or a current class schedule.
